1. The five lines that we write music on is called the STAVE
2. Music is organised into BARS. The lines that separate these are called BAR LINES.
3. What is this sign called ? TREBLE CLEF
4. The time signature is 4/4. This means that there are FOUR crotchet beats in every bar.
