

#### **Making Chords**

On the following pages, we're going to learn how to make some chords. When we do this, it's really important that we keep our thumb in the right place. This is because it's going to make it easier for us to stretch our fingers round and make really good, clear sounding chords!




#### The 'C' Chord





Make sure you use your third finger (one along from your pinky!) like me. It's really important that we use the right fingers

#### The 'F' Chord





If using two fingers is a bit tricky, start off with one, like this:



#### **Strumming**

Now we're going to learn to strum these chords. To strum, take your fingers and push through all of the strings in a downwards motion!




If you're finding that it hurts your fingers, use the fleshy bit of your thumb instead. If you have a plectrum - you can use that too!

#### Strumming 'C'

We want to strum on the number with the purple arrow above it. Ask somebody to count for you. Get them to go '1, 2, 3, 4, 1, 2, 3, 4' in a loop. When they say 'one' - that's when you strum!









#### Strumming 'C'

For this one, we want to strum on the numbers two and four. This makes a rhythm that's really important in pop music - it's called a 'backbeat'. It's a bit trickier and will take practice!




#### Strumming 'F'

Now try the same with the F chord. Keep counting!




#### Strumming 'C' and 'F'

# Reggae

Reggae comes from a country in the Caribbean called Jamaica.

#### **Listening**

If you can get onto Spotify or Youtube, have a listen to one of Bob Marley's songs called 'Three Little Birds'.

#### Ask yourself:

Can you hear any instruments that you recognise?
How does the music make you feel?
Why does it make you feel like that?
What message are the words giving us?
What's the weather like in Jamaica? Find out! Can you hear this in the music do you think?


#### **'Three Little Birds'**


#### Learning 'Aminor'



Remember to keep your thumb in the right place! Keep it low down, this means we can stretch our fingers round further!



#### Learning 'Aminor'





**Listen** to your Aminor chord when you strum it. How does it make you feel? Then try C and F. How do these ones make you feel?


When we put the word '**minor**' next to a chord, it tells us that the chord is going to sound quite sad or melancholy. Sometimes we shorten 'minor' to 'min', or even just 'm'.

The full name of 'C' and 'F' is 'Cmajor' and 'Fmajor'. **Major** chords sound happy and upbeat! We usually lose the 'major' bit when talking about these chords, just to save time!

#### Louis Armstrong



Louis Armstrong was very important in the creation of jazz music. He came from New Orleans, in the USA - and is famous for playing the trumpet, singing, and composing too.



#### **Listening**


Go onto Youtube and see if you can find some videos of Louis Armstrong performing. There's a brilliant video on there called 'Louis Armstrong - Show of The Week (1968)'.

#### Ask yourself:

# What instruments do you recognise? How would you describe the sound of those instruments? How does the music make you feel? Why does it make you feel like that?

In a moment, we're going to have a go at playing 'When The Saints Go Marching In' - a song which Louis Armstrong used to play. See if you can find a recording of him playing the song on Spotify or Youtube - there are lots!






## **Strumming 'Oh When The Saints'**



If you're finding the chord changes tricky - as a warmup, just practice changing chords with your left hand, changing between C, F and G7. Don't worry about strumming.










