Emotion Station

When you sing a song, you are telling a story or conveying a part of the narrative of the show. Choose an easy chorus of your favourite song and say it out loud in the emotion you roll on your dice.



Notice the difference in how you use your voice. The tone and texture will change depending on the emotion you are trying to communicate. The speed will differ as will as the diction.

Now try singing your chorus in the emotion you roll on the dice.

Character

"I'm a singer not an actor" I hear you cry! But you have to be a little bit of both. Whether you are singing on stage or safe behind a pop shield and headphones, you have to portray that character in order to put the right message of the song across.



Character Activity

Have a go at learning one of these monologues. Ask yourself the following questions

- Who is the character?
- What is happening in the story at this moment?
- What are their physical attributes?
- · What does their voice sound like?
- What emotions are they showing throughout the monologue?
- What message do you want to portray?

Video yourself and watch it back.

- Were you convincing?
- What could you improve or change?
- · What worked?

Once you get used to this process, go back to your songs. Apply the same kind of questions to the character in the song or the storyline or idea if it's a pop song.

ABE

Kid Hero (Boy or Girl)

I've always dreamed of being a hero. I've tried everything to become super. I let a spider bite me... no spider powers; just lots of itching. I love being a hero. I love helping people. I love making them happy. And I hate bad guys. I hate creeps who hurt people.

There's this kid at school... he is always hurting everyone. I am sick of him hurting us. I just need those super powers to make him stop!.

Maybe if I eat more of the school lunches. They look radioactive... something is bound to happen. *(excited)*

And I need a catch phrase like "gonna smoosh me a baddie"... and a cool costume... CAn't wait to be a hero!

Charlie & The Chocolate Factory (Roald Dahl) Slugworth:

I congratulate you, little boy. Well done. You found the fifth Golden Ticket. May I introduce myself. Arthur Slugworth, President of Slugworth Chocolates, Incorporated. Confidence is **Key**


